The Northern Rhode Island Collaborative is pleased to offer Non-Violent Crisis Prevention Intervention training for all professionals working with students. The Non-Violent Crisis Prevention Intervention Program is a safe, non-harmful behavior management system to assist human service providers provide the best possible care, welfare, safety and security of disruptive, assaultive and out-of-control individuals even during their most violent moments. Participants in the training will develop an understanding of the Rhode Island Regulations regarding Non-Violent Crisis Prevention Intervention.



Discussed topics will include:

- What interventions are allowed and what are prohibited;
- Techniques to assist individuals in keeping student acting-out behavior at the lowest, least threatening levels;
- How to intervene in crisis situations appropriately and in a way which will not damage the professional bond you have established with the individuals in your care.
